FALL FERTILIZATION: YOUR LAWN'S MOST IMPORTANT MEAL

As the days grow colder and shorter, it is tempting to shift our focus towards hearth and home and away from the lawn. Fighting this temptation can yield dividends come spring if you manage to squeeze in one more application of fertilizer in late fall. Many of the challenges your lawn faces during the hot summer months have run their course

by the time cooler weather sets in. Lawns no longer have to contend with the scorching heat which stresses the turf. Unlike in the dog days of summer, in the fall, your lawn does not require extensive watering just to stay alive. Lack of regular mowing means that grass can stop focusing its efforts on weekly blade growth and can instead concentrate on root growth and rejuvenation. This unique situation makes late fall an ideal time to fertilize your lawn.

As your lawn shifts its priorities, it changes the way it uses the nutrients in fertilizer. In the spring, high nitrogen levels lead to quick top growth, but that same nitrogen applied in the fall will be put to use strengthening the turfgrass roots and storing energy reserves for the winter. This will ensure that your lawn will green up early in the spring and be resistant to disease and drought throughout the summer.



While it may seem counterintuitive to fertilize this time of year, your lawn can benefit more from these applications than from any other seasonal fertilization. Your lawn will especially benefit if it receives a fall application before the grass has gone completely dormant. In southern Ohio, we typically have totally dormant (brown) grass sometime in early to mid-December.
